Please ensure your child is at school on time and in the correct school uniform. Lessons begin at 9am and children who are regularly coming in late are missing essential learning every day.



Learning Challenge:

Children are developing independent learning skills through an enquiry based learning approach through our learning challenge curriculum. Children have this opportunity to develop cross curricular knowledge through thought provoking questions which help them lead the enquiry.

This Spring half term children will be investigating all about the Invaders and settlers. They will develop a deeper understanding of the topic by exploring who the Vikings, Anglo-Saxons and the Normans were, which battles they fought, who their kings were and what life was like in those times. In science we will learn all about light and discover that we need light in order to see things and that dark is an absence of light. In geography, we will learn how to use the four points of a compass to locate the main physical and human features of the UK, and observe how these have changed since Viking times. In history, we will learn about the Anglo Saxon laws and justice. In English, we will be reading the lovely fiction book, How to train a dragon.

Quick tips to support learning at home

Growth Mindset

Why do some people achieve their potential while others do not?

In school we have been focussing on the importance of our mindset. Our mental attitude can determine how we interpret and respond to situations. We tell the children the brain is like a muscle that gets stronger and better the more it is exercised. This sends the message that intelligence can be learnt, and that we are not born 'intelligent'. But with hard work and persistence our brain makes new connections and we become smarter.

We have been focussing on the power of the word 'yet'. When children find their work challenging their response is 'I can't do it yet!', knowing that if they keep trying, eventually, they will be able to feel that sense of achievement.
